Each year, we serve more than 6,500 consumers.

And everything that we do is guided by the independent living philosophy.

The independent living philosophy is based on the idea that people with disabilities deserve the same rights as everyone else to make their own life choices.

There's several key principles which include self-determination, where people with disabilities should have control over important decisions such as where they live, work, and socialize.

Consumer control, it emphasizes that people with disabilities best understand their own needs, which is why independent living centers are led and managed by individuals with disabilities.

Empowerment, the focus is on encouraging independence rather than reliance, so supporting people as they take charge of their lives and seek out support when needed.

And finally, choice and freedom.

This philosophy insists that everyone should be free to decide how and with whom they want to live, making choices that reflect their values and preferences.

And can you explain why Giving Tuesday is so important to our agency?

Giving Tuesday on December 2nd is an online giving day that is one of the largest fundraisers we organize each year.
