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It's set up as a central hub for the beginning of your employment search.

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It's a motivational space where you can come and work independently and where there's always someone on hand who can answer your questions.

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We have six workstations.

They each have dedicated phone lines and computers that can be used for career searches, communicating with potential employers, or even just working on your resumes.

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We offer resources for training and educational opportunities toward your career goals.

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And we even have hot leads on new jobs that are available all the time.

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If you need even more support, you can work one-on-one with job coaches.

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But I don't want to get ahead of myself, Ernie, because I feel like you may have more questions before I go there.

Well, the first one that I would suggest is we are in-house right now offering a CDL-A class, which we are paying for completely from beginning to end.

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Every Wednesday, we're having classes in-house from 2:30 to 4, and they're covering everything from general knowledge all the way up to

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air brakes, combination vehicles, tanker vehicle endorsements.

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Once you go through the actual classes, you then take the written test at the DMV, the DOT physical, and then of course over to the DMV to get your actual license.

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We pay for each part and we accompany you through each part of the process.

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So, once you are a member of MHPC, the entire process is covered by

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our organization, you pay nothing out of pocket.
